* A 'miracle vaccine.'

"It's a miracle vaccine' that can boost our kids' immunity to the world's heaviness and that is the power of story. So I feel that through using stories we can connect our kids with people and places on the other side of the world and as they fall deeper in love with these stories, I think it helps them maintain that natural God-given wonder for the world they were born with.

Are your kids fully vaccinated with the miracle vaccine of good stories? Which stories have built up a sense of wonder in your kids?

* A perspective shift.

"It gives us a chance to become that sort of person. It changes our perspective. Our perspective changes everything because then it changes the way that we act, it changes our calling and what we feel led to do, what we feel capable of doing."

Books like Give Your Child the World really do enlarge our sense of the possible. And what a gift to give our children—a clearer sense of the world and their place in it. Of course, this change in perspective isn't only for our children! How have you been changed through reading?

* 'We can deepen our compassion.'

"So, when I talk in Give Your Child the World about our kids being world changers, I don't necessarily mean that they're going to be the next Nelson Mandela or something lofty like that. What I mean is that through our love for the world we can deepen our compassion which naturally leads us to act out of love and that naturally changes the world, so we all have the ability to be world changers and to raise world changers."

I have a friend who, instead of worrying over job prospects for her growing kids, prays for their vocations. The deepening compassion and love that Jamie mentions go hand in hand with those prayers. How are your children being fitted and prepared for their vocations?
